The witchcraft act of 1604 (1 Jac. I. c. 12) A2r . . . At the Parliament begun and holden at Westminster the xix. day of March, in the first yeere of the Raigne of our most Gracious Soueraigne Lord IAMES, by the Grace of God of England, France and Ireland King, Defender of the Faith, &c. and of Scotland the 37. And there continued vntil the seuenth day of Iuly 1604. And then proroged vntil the 7. of Febr. next following. To the High pleasure of Almightie God, and to the weale Publique of this Realme were enacted as followeth. . . . C8r An Acte against Coniuration, Witchcraft, and dealing with euill and wicked Spirits. Chap. XII. Bee it enacted by the King our Soueraigne Lord, the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and the Commons in this present Parliament assembled, and by the authoritie of the same, That the Statute made in the fift yere of the Reigne of our late Soueraigne Lady of most famous and happy memorie Queene Elizabeth, intituled, An Acte against Coniurations, Inchantments, and Witchcrafts, be from the Feast of S. Michael the Archangel next comming, for and concerning all offences to be committed after the same Feast, vtterly repealed. And for the better restraining the said offences, and more seuere punishing the same, Be it further enacted by the authoritie aforesaid, That if any person or persons, after the saide Feast of Saint Michael the Archangel next comming, shall vse, practise, or exercise any Inuocation, or Coniuration, of any euill and wicked spirit, or shall consult, couenant with, entertaine, employ, feede, or reward, any euill and wicked spirit, to, or for any intent or purpose, or take vp any dead man, woman, or child, out of his, her, or their graue, or any other place, where the dead body resteth, or the skin, bone, or any other part of any dead person, to bee employed or vsed in any maner of Witchcraft, Sorcery, charme or Inchantment, or shall vse, practise, or exercise any Witchcraft, Inchantment, Charme, or Sorcerie, whereby any person shall be killed, destroyed, wasted, consumed, pined, or lamed in his or her body, or any part thereof: That then euery such Offendor or Offendors, their Ayders, Abettors, and Counsellors, being of any the said offences duely and lawful-

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ly conuicted, and attainted, shall suffer paines of death, as a Felon, or Felons, and shall lose the priuiledge and benefit of Clergie, and Sanctuary.

And further, to the intent that all manner of Practise, Vse, or exercise of Witchcraft, Enchantment, Charme, or Sorcery, should be from hencefoorth vtterly auoyded, abolished, and taken away, Be it enacted by the authority of this present Parliament, That if any person or persons, shall from and after the said Feast of Saint Michael the Archangel next comming, take vpon him or them by Witchcraft, Inchantment, Charme, or Sorcerie, to tell, or declare in what place any treasure of Golde, or Siluer, should, or might be found or had in the earth, or other secret places, or where goods or things lost or stollen should be found, or become, or to the intent to prouoke any person to vnlawfull Loue, or whereby any Cattell or Goods of any person shalbe destroyed, wasted or impaired, or to hurt or destroy any person in his, or her body, although the same be not effected and done: That then all and every such person or persons so offending, and being thereof lawfully conuicted, shall for the said offence suffer imprisonment by the space of one whole yeere, without bayle or mainprise, and once in euery quarter of the sayd yeere, shall in some Market Towne vpon the Market day, or at such time, as any Faire shalbe kept, there stand openly vpon the Pillorie by the space of sixe houres, and there shall openly confesse his or her error and offence. And if any person or persons being once conuicted of the same offences, as is aforesayd, doe eftsoones perpetrate and commit the like offence, That then euery such offendor being of any the sayd offences the second time lawfully and duely conuicted, and attainted, as is aforesayd, shall suffer paines of death as a Felon, or Felons, and shall lose the benefit and priviledge of Clergie, and Sanctuary. Saving to the wife of such person as shall offend in any thing contrary to this Act her title of Dower, and also to the heire, and successor of euery such person, his or their titles of inheritance, succession, and other rights, as though no such Attaindor of the Ancestor, or Predecessor had bene made. Prouided alwayes that if the Offendor in any the cases aforesayd, shall happen to be a Peere of the Realme, then his triall therein to be had by his Peeres, as it is vsed in cases of Felony or Treason, and not otherwise.
