ROCHESTER,
WITH STROOD, FRINDSBURY, AND UPNOR.

ROCHESTER is a city, consisting of the parishes of St. Nicholas and St. Margaret, and Chatham Intra, on the right bank of the navigable river Medway, and part of the parishes of Strood and Frindsbury on the left bank. It is a polling place for the Western division of the county, and is 29 miles from London, 8 from Maidstone, 7 from Gravesend, 27 from Canterbury, and 42 from Dover. There is a station on the North Kent line at Strood, and likewise on the London, Chatham and Dover Railway at Rochester Bridge. It is the see of a Bishop, whose jurisdiction extends over the deanery of Rochester and the counties of Essex and Herts; it formerly extended over the whole of West Kent. It is in the Medway union, which comprises the city of Rochester, the borough of Chatham, and the parish of Gillingham. Strood and Frindsbury form a part of the North Aylesford union. The city is paved, well lighted with gas, and supplied with water from a reservoir at Gillingham: it is straggling, and extends for a considerable distance along the river banks.

Rochester has a corporation, the first charter for which was granted by Henry II., A.D. 1165: it now comprises a mayor, recorder, aldermen, and town councillors. Quarter sessions are held here. There is also a commission of the peace for the city of Rochester.

The markets at Rochester are, -- for corn on Tuesdays, and for cattle on the fourth Tuesday in each month. A fair is held at Rochester on the 18th of May, and at Strood on the 26th, 27th, and 28th of August.

Rochester and Chatham enjoy their principal advantage from being the seat of a grand naval and military station; but they have also considerable trade, and fisheries. At the establishment of Messrs. Aveling and Porter, manufacturers of the patent traction engine for agricultural and other purposes, a great number of men are employed. There is also a manufactory of agricultural implements carried on by Cutbert Russell.

The city has been well fortified since the attack of the Dutch in Charles II.'s time, who sailed up the Medway and burnt several vessels. Rochester is the seat of a customs port of entry, the receipts of which, are about £10,800 per annum. The excise district, or collection, has also its head quarters here. Being on the high road to Dover, there is much traffic through the city. Rochester was called Dourbryf by the Britons, which signifies a swift stream, in allusion to the rapidity of the Medway. The Romans called it Durobrovis and Durobrovum. By the Saxons it was denominated Hroffeceaster, from the name of one Hroffe or Roffe, who erected some buildings here, and from castrum or

castle, which when used implies that the Romans had a camp there. Ethelbert the Britwald, and King of Kent, founded here the Cathedral and Bishop's See in 604, when Justus, who was sent from Rome, A.D. 601, to assist St. Augustine in the conversion of the Anglo Saxons to Christianity, was appointed the first bishop. In 676 the city was destroyed by Ethelred, King of Mercia, and again by the Danes in 839: it was besieged by the Danes in 885, but relieved by King Alfred: in 986 it was besieged by King Ethelred: in 998 it was sacked by the Danes, and William Rufus besieged and took the castle. The city was nearly destroyed by fire in 1130, 1137, and 1177. In 1215 the castle was taken by King John; in 1216 retaken by the Dauphin, Louis of France, and in 1217 retaken again. In 1264 the town was taken and the castle besieged by Simon de Montfort, Earl of Leicester, the founder of our Parliamentary liberties. Wat Tyler, in his insurrection, attacked the castle. In 1688 King James II. embarked here secretly, when fleeing the country on his abdication.

Rochester Cathedral is an edifice remarkable for its antiquity: it was founded in 604, but is of various ages, and consists of a nave, aisles, choir (raised by ten steps above the nave), a principal transept, and a smaller transept at the east end of the choir: the dimensions are, 306 feet in length (nave 150, choir 156), 122 feet in breadth across the great transept, and 90 feet across the smaller transept: the building forms a double cross: at the intersection of the transepts in the centre is a tower, erected in very bad taste in 1825: on the north side of the choir is Gundulph's tower, and at the west end are two small towers: the western part is in the enriched Norman style: the nave was built by Bishop Gundulph in the eleventh century, and has Norman piers and arches: other parts of the cathedral are also of the early Norman: the crypt, or undercroft, under the cathedral, is very spacious: in 1840 the whole interior was repaired

and restored, and has been very much improved. St. Paulinus, St. Ithamar, and St. William, are buried here. St. William of Rochester was a Scotch baker, who was killed while on a pilgrimage to Jerusalem in 1201, on the road to Canterbury, and was canonized: his shrine attracted many votaries. There are also tombs of Bishops De Inglethorpe, Haymo de Hethe, Laurence de St. Martin, John de Sheppey, Glanville de Merton (Lord Chancellor and founder of Merton College, Oxford, whose tomb is of Limoges enamelled work), Lowe, Warner (the founder of Bromley College), and Bradfield; also of Lord and Lady Henniker. The chapter-house is now in ruins. The library contains some ancient MSS.; among others, the celebrated register of the diocese, the Textus Roffensis, and the Custumule Roffense, composed about 1320. The establishment of the cathedral consists of a bishop (formerly this was the poorest see in England, but is now made up to £5,000 per annum), dean, archdeacon, four canons, four minor canons, chancellor, six lay clerks, eight choristers, and with a Grammar school attached (with a master and twenty scholars), the management of which by the Dean and Chapter was the subject of much controversy and litigation in 1853. The gross income of the Dean and

Chapter has been returned at £7,178 per annum, and the nett income £5,106. £14,000 was spent between 1827 and 1834 in the repairs. Rochester had formerly four parish churches, but the site of St. Mary's is forgotten.

St. Margaret's church, Rochester (except the tower) was rebuilt a few years since: it has a curious stone font, and some old monuments. The living is a vicarage, annual value £389, with residence, in the gift of the Dean and Chapter, and held by the Rev. William Henry Drage, M.A., of St. John's College, Cambridge.

St. Nicholas' church, Rochester, is ancient, and has a curious octagonal font of stone: this church was built in 1421, and greatly enlarged and improved in 1624: it has recently undergone a thorough repair. The living is a vicarage, with that of St. Clement's annexed, value £150, with residence, in the gift of the Bishop of Rochester, and held by the Rev. Claude Bosanquet, M.A., of Oriel College, Oxford.

St. Clement's church, Rochester, is now demolished, and the parish united to that of St. Nicholas.

St. Peter's, Troy town, is a district church of St. Margaret's, erected in 1859, at a cost of £6,000; it is a handsome stone and brick building, in the Lombardo-Venetian style, consisting of nave, chancel, and south aisle. The living is a perpetual curacy, in the gift of the Dean and Chapter of Rochester, and held by the Rev. Henry Frederick Phillips, M.A., of University College, Oxford.

The Guildhall, erected in 1687, is the building in which the sittings of the city magistrates are held: it contains some portraits of considerable merit. The Corn Exchange has the usual accommodation for the transaction of business. The Gaol is used for the purposes of the local jurisdiction. The Gas Works are on a considerable scale, suited to the population.

Rochester Castle is an ancient edifice, of Norman architecture, near the bridge, with very thick walls of Kentish ragstone. The keep is one of the finest castellated ruins in the kingdom.

The Cathedral Grammar school was founded by King Henry VIII.; head master, the Rev. Robert Whiston, M.A., late Fellow of Trinity College, Cambridge; second master, the Rev. John Espin, M.A., of Merton College, Oxford. The average cost for each boy is about £60: twenty King's scholars are educated free of charge, and receive an annual allowance of £21 13s. 4d.; their selection, after an examination, is vested in the Dean and Chapter of Rochester, and any boy between the ages of nine and fifteen is eligible: the boys educated at this school are entitled to four exhibitions, two at Oxford, and two at Cambridge, of the yearly value of £30 10s. during residence, paid by the Dean and Chapter; they are also entitled to two of the Gunsley exhibitions at University College, Oxford, of the yearly value of £25 during residence: the electors are the Master and Fellows of the College, and each exhibitioner is allowed £15 per annum from the date of his election to the commencement of his residence at Oxford: there is also another exhibition of £5, in the gift of the head master: there is an annual examination, conducted by a gentleman appointed

by the Dean and Chapter: annual prizes, to the amount of £10 10s., are given by the representatives of Rochester to those pupils who distinguish themselves most in classics,

mathematics, and the French language respectively: the average number of scholars is about 60.

Williamson's Free school was founded in 1701 by Sir Joseph Williamson, with the object of fitting scholars, sons of freemen, for the sea service, who bequeathed £5,000 in perpetuity for its support: the income of this school is now nearly £900 per annum: Garrick and Professor Henslow were pupils in it: the head master is the Rev. T. Cobb, M.A., of Sidney Sussex College, Cambridge, and the second master is Charles Bathurst, Esq., M.A., of St. John's College, Cambridge. There are also National and British schools. The Theatre is principally supported by the garrison and its officers. On the Medway are floating baths. There is also a reading room and library of the Rochester Church of England Institute in the High-street.

The Poor Travellers' House, founded and endowed by Richard Watts, Esq., in the reign of Queen Elizabeth, for six poor travellers, has an inscription on it, stating that neither "rogues nor proctors will be admitted;" each traveller receives a night's lodging, a supper, and fourpence on leaving in the morning: the revenues, which at the time of the donor's death were small, have so increased as to amount at the present time to £3,500 per annum: in July, 1855, a scheme was sanctioned by the Court of Chancery for the building an almshouse for ten men and ten women, fourteen of whom were to receive £30 a year each, a head nurse £60 a year, a porter £50, and four nurses £50 a year each: a splendid set of almshouses, in the Elizabethan style, has been erected in the Maidstone-road, at a cost of nearly £10,000, with two magnificent gateways, at a cost of £350 each, designed by Mr. Webb, of London, and built by Mr. James Gough Naylar, contractor, of Rochester: the scheme likewise empowered the trustees to give a sum of £4,000 towards the erection of a general hospital for the benefit of the city and neighbourhood, and a sum of £1,000 per annum towards its support.

St. Bartholomew's hospital was originally founded by Gundulph, Bishop of Rochester, in 1078, for the benefit of lepers returning from the Crusades, and after many years of abeyance, was reconstituted in 1858, and a handsome general hospital was erected on the New-road, which was opened in 1863, and is supported from the revenues of the St. Bartholomew's estate, a grant from government, £1,000 per annum from Watts's charity, and by voluntary subscriptions.

St. Catherine's hospital, Star-hill, was founded by Symon Potyn, 1316, and is now appropriated for the residence of sixteen aged females, with stipends from £24 to £28 per annum each.

Hawkins's charity, in Chatham Intra, is for decayed seamen: the inmates are appointed by the dock authorities.

The bridge over the Medway is a handsome and substantial

iron structure of three arches, erected in 1857 and 1858, at a cost of £200,000, which was defrayed partly by an accumulated fund arising from the bridge estate, the remainder having been borrowed on mortgage of the same fund.

The County Court office, erected in 1862, is in Eastgate, and is a handsome and commodious brick building, a combination of Venetian and Elizabethan architecture: the district comprises the following twenty-two parishes, viz.: -- Allhallows, Burham, Borstal, Cathedral, Precinct (Rochester), Chatham, Cliffe, Cooling, Cuxton, Frindsbury, Gillingham, Isle of Graine, Grange, Halling, High Halstow, Hoo, Lid-sing, Luton, St. Mary's (Hoo), St. Margaret's (Rochester), St. Nicholas (Rochester), Stoke, and Wouldham.

The population in 1861 was -- St. Nicholas, 3,442; St. Margaret's, 8,130; military in Forts Pitt and Clarence, 609: the population of the whole of the parish of Strood is 4,075; Frindsbury whole parish, 2,219: total, 18,475.

TROY TOWN is a southern suburb; DELCE, half a mile south; BORSTAL, one mile south-west.
